National and International Successes

In January, Ollie Jeapes represented England in the British Isles Under 18 International Series in Wales. It was a series to remember for Ollie as he came away with the gold medal in the triples and England secured team silver behind Scotland who won the series. In the triples, Ollie was joined by Sam Brugnoli from Huntingdon and Charlie Beeton from Ipswich who dominated the field with wins against Ireland (6-5, 13-0), Wales (10-3, 14-1) and they continued their impressive form in the gold medal match against Scotland (8-1, 5-1). Well done to Ollie and the rest of Team England. You should be very proud, and we are sure that you will have more opportunities to represent your country in the future.






We are also proud to announce that we have two newly crowned national champions at the club. Ruby Hill won the national under 25 singles for the second time and Dominic McVittie won the national champion of champions.

The under 25 singles finals were held at Solihull IBC in January and Ruby qualified with wins earlier in the season against Alice Atkin from Church Gresley and Amica Fordy from Hartlepool. At the finals, Ruby secured straight sets wins against Yasmina Hasan from Egham and Hannah Smith from Malvern Hills before booking her place in the final against fellow under 25 international, Imogen Jenner from Swale. Ruby made light work of winning the first set 12-3 and scored a timely full house of four shots on the penultimate end of the second set to go 8-5 up. Ruby held her nerve to score one shot on the last end and win the set 9-5. Ruby won the under 25 singles for the second

time and will represent England at the British Isles Championships in March and the Junior World Championships next season.

The champion of champions finals were held at Dolphin IBC in Dorset. Dominic was joined by Chelsea Spencer who also qualified in the ladies' event, but she lost in the last 16 against eventual runner up Morgan Merryweather from Whiteknights. Dominic came through a strong field, beating Dex Weyand from Thanet 21-8 in the last 16 before overcoming a 14-6 deficit in the quarter final to beat John McGuinness from Desborough 21-20. In the semi-final, Dominic continued his excellent form to beat Darren Griffith from Isle of Wight 21-8 to book his place in the final where he played fellow international and former winner of the event, Martin Puckett from Dorchester. Dominic showed his class in winning the final 21-7. Although winning the national under 25 singles title back in 2016, this is the first time that Dominic has won an individual indoor senior national title, so it was a special moment when he was presented with the champion of champions trophy.



National Inter-Club Knockout Updates

Over the last couple of months, Spalding Lightning have been progressing nicely in national inter-club competitions and are through to the final of the Denny Cup and the semi-final of the Egham Trophy, Top Club and the "David Cornwell" Under 30 Double Triples. This is an exciting time of the season, and we hope that you will help get behind our players to bring more national success back to the club.

Starting with the Denny Cup, we have beaten Stamford (95-58), Grantham (100-43), Boston (85-67) and Huntingdon (81-65) before two nail biting finishes against Nottingham (69-68) and a very strong Cumbria side (77-76). In the semi-final, we were dominant in beating Falcon (88-54) and will play Torquay in the final at Nottingham IBC on Saturday 13th April 2024. Thank you also to all of our travelling supporters. In the Egham Trophy, we will be looking to improve on our semi-final defeat from last season. So far, we have beaten Stamford (88-46), Boston (93-64), Grantham (104-50), Huntingdon (68-67) and Barwell (76-26) before an impressive quarterfinal fightback against Norfolk Bowling Club to win by four shots (84-80). In the semi-final, we will play Wellingborough on Sunday 3rd March 2024 at a neutral venue yet to be confirmed. In the Top Club, we have beaten Sleaford (16-0), Peterborough (12-4), Huntingdon (12-4), Nottingham (14-2) and Acle (14-2). In the semi-final, we will play Hartlepool on Saturday 23rd March 2024 at the national championships at Nottingham IBC. It will hopefully prove to be a busy weekend as if we are successful in the semi-final of both the Top Club and Egham Trophy, the finals will be played on Sunday 24th March 2024 in the morning and afternoon respectively. Certainly not forgetting our under 30s who are defending champions of the competition and this season have so far beaten Boston (41-31) and Hartlepool (33-9). In the semi-final, we will play Wellingborough on Saturday 6th April 2024, also at the national championships at Nottingham IBC, with the final to hopefully follow later that day.
